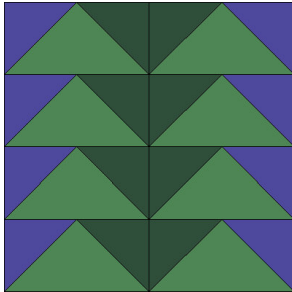

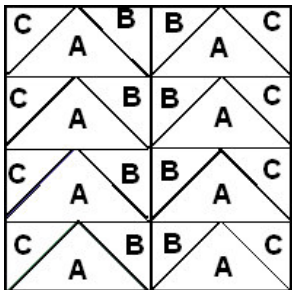
## Block 4

## Goose Pine Tree


12" finished block, 12 1/2" unfinished block.




- Sew seams away from the center piece.
- Sew scant 1/4" seam allowances, do not open seams.
- Lay out block pieces as cut, following diagram if necessary.
- Dry Press seams away from center. Move iron in one direction only – center out to edges, never iron back and forth, you are pressing seams not ironing wrinkles. Do not use steam until block is finished.
- Chain sew when possible and use an anchor or tail to prevent thread nesting on bobbin side.



### Colors & Size of pieces: Cutting measurements

A. Medium Green = 2 squares 7 1/4". Cut "X" diagonally to make 8 triangles.   
Blocks: 1 = 7.5" x 15"; 2 = 7.5" x 30"; 5 = 16" x 42"; 7 = 2/3 yard

B. Dark Green Corners = 4 squares 3 7/8". Cut "\ " diagonally to make 8 triangles.   
Blocks: 1 = 4" x 16"; 2 = 4" x 32"; 5 = 8" x 42", 1/4 yd; 7 = 1/3 yd

C. Blue Corners = 4 squares 3 7/8". Cut "\ " diagonally to make 8 triangles.  
Blocks: 1 = 4" x 16"; 2 = 4" x 32"; 5 = 8" x 42", 1/4 yd; 7 = 1/3 yd

### Assembly

You are working on the bias, DO NOT STRETCH OR PULL FABRIC.

1. Cut flying geese centers first from "A" medium green 7.25" squares in "X" as shown in diagram.
2. Cut B and C, corner squares on the diagonal "\ " only.
3. Sew the dark greens center to half of flying geese.
  - a. Sew long sides of B to 4 right short sides of "A" goose centers.
  - b. Next sew the long sides of B to 4 left short side of "A" goose centers.
4. Open fabric and press if desired, (seams away from goose points).
5. Sew outside blue edges to goose centers.
  - a. Sew long sides of "C" to opposite side of goose points. Sewing 4 triangles onto the left and four onto the right to form flying goose segment.
6. Sew two flying geese segments together four times making sure the dark green centers are together. Also be sure the geese are all flying the same direction.
7. Sew four patch together. Sewing 2 squares together and then each half together.

### Quilt Row Assembly

Attach Pine tree top point (Row 3) to the top of these three blocks to make an 18.5" x 12.5" unfinished block. Do not assemble row 3-4 until each unit is combined to make larger blocks.
