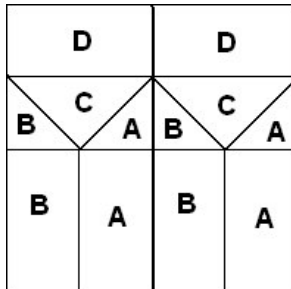
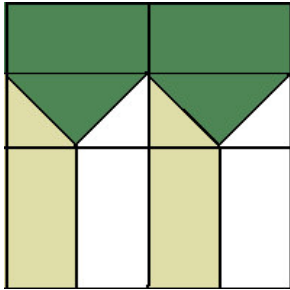

Block 6

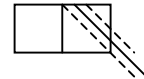
Grass & Fence

12" finished block, 12 1/2" unfinished block.



- Sew seams away from the center piece.
- Sew scant 1/4" seam allowances, do not open seams.
- Lay out block pieces as cut, following diagram if necessary.
- Dry Press seams away from center. Move iron in one direction only, lift and press from center out to edges. Never iron back and forth, you are pressing seams not ironing wrinkles. Do not use steam until block is finished, water resets and distorts natural cotton fibers.
- Chain-sew when possible and use an anchor or tail to prevent thread nesting on bobbin side.

Colors & Size of pieces: Cutting measurements Row 5: Make 7 blocks



- A. Cream 1 = 2 pieces, fence 3 1/2" x 6 1/2", and goose corners 2 sqs. 3 1/2".
Blocks: 1 = 3 1/2" x 21"; 2 = 3 1/2" x 42"; 5 = 12" x 42", 1/3 yd; 7 = 1/2 yd
- B. Cream 2 = 2 pieces, fence 3 1/2" x 6 1/2", and goose corners 2 squares 3 1/2"
Blocks: 1 = 3 1/2" x 21"; 2 = 3 1/2" x 42"; 5 = 12" x 42", 1/3 yd; 7 = 1/2 yd
- C. Green Goose Centers = 2 pieces, 3 1/2" x 6 1/2".
Blocks: 1 = 3 1/2" x 14"; 2 = 3 1/2" x 28"; 5 = 8" x 42", 1/4 yd; 7 = 1/3 yd
- D. Green Grass = 2 pieces, 3 1/2" x 6 1/2". Or 1, 3 1/2" x 12 1/2"
Blocks: 1 = 3 1/2" x 14"; 2 = 3 1/2" x 28"; 5 = 8" x 42", 1/4 yd; 7 = 1/3 yard

Assembly

- 7 Blocks make entire row. Flying Goose Stitch & Flip Method using squares.
1. Cut out flying geese fabric rectangles "C" and squares A & B part 2 as described above.
 2. Bottom of fence.
 - a. Sew the rest of long strips AB together.
 - b. Cut strip into 6 1/2" segments.
 - c. Sew 2 BA,BA segments together for the bottom half of block.
 3. Sew the green center to half of flying geese.
 - a. Draw line down center diagonal of all 3 1/2" squares. (Draw extra 1/2" line away from center to save time and fabric scraps).
 - b. Sew down each draw line and trim away extra leaving 1/4" seam allowance.
 - c. Sew Cream 1 "A" on one side and cream 2 "B" on the other side to make the points correctly as shown in diagram above.
 4. Open fabric and press if desired, (seams toward goose points).
 5. Sew flying geese together with "D" pieces to make top half of block.
 6. Sew block halves together.

Quilt Row Assembly

Sew 7 grass and fence blocks together to finish Row 5 these blocks make a 12.5" x 84.5" unfinished row. Assemble rows as desired or in order of quilt.
